

Buffalo Medical Group to Host Breast Cancer Program

WILLIAMSVILLE, NY – *The Many Faces of Breast Cancer*, a national program that focuses on educating women about the risks of breast cancer and providing support to the growing community of breast cancer survivors, will be held on Saturday, October 3 from 10 am to noon at Marinaccio's in Williamsville.
