

BMG Physicians to Present Program on Colorectal Cancer

WILLIAMSVILLE, NY – “Straight Talk About Colorectal Cancer,” is the theme of a community education program to be presented by Buffalo Medical Group (BMG) on Saturday, March 27 from 10 am to noon in the Gleasner Hall auditorium at Erie Community College North, 6205 Main Street, Williamsville.

There will be a question and answer session after the presentations.
